

## ISO 20121 Sustainable development policy

### 2026 Porsche Carrera Cup Italia & 2026 Porsche Taycan Rush

Considered the highest expression of motorsport and the purest brand's identity, the Porsche Carrera Cup Italia is the Italian one-make championship in which the iconic Porsche 911 GT3 Cup cars compete.

The championship, divided into four rankings – Absolute, Rookie, Michelin Cup and Teams – consists of twelve rounds, held over six weekends, from April to November, at five of the most famous and prestigious circuits in Italy: Autodromo Internazionale Enzo e Dino Ferrari (Emilia-Romagna), Misano World Circuit Marco Simoncelli (Emilia-Romagna), Autodromo Nazionale di Monza (Lombardy), Autodromo Vallelunga Piero Taruffi (Lazio) e Mugello Circuit (Tuscany).

For the second consecutive year, the 2026 Porsche Taycan Rush – the brand's full-electric championship – will join the Porsche Carrera Cup Italia at every round, except for the Monza one.

Aligned with the Group's strategy Porsche Strategy 2035, which encompasses the sustainability strategy, founded on six strategic areas:

- Decarbonization,
- Circular economy,
- Diversity,
- Partner to society,
- Supply chain responsibility,
- Governance and transparency

Porsche Italia S.p.A. has decided to adopt an internationally recognized management system in for the 2026 Porsche Carrera Cup Italia and 2026 Porsche Taycan Rush, with the aim of obtaining the ISO 20121:2024 certification, the prestigious standard for event sustainability management systems, pursuing its goals of climate change mitigation and enhancing social and economic benefits in the short, medium and long term.

This decision leads to the implementation of the values promoted by the ISO 20121:2024 standard on which this policy is based, as stated in the document "4.5 Mission statement\_ISO 20121\_PCCI\_Taycan Rush 2026 eng", such as:

- Stewardship,
- Inclusion and accessibility,
- Integrity,
- Transparency,
- Participation,
- Legacy.

In accordance with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), Porsche Italia S.p.A. implements an ESG strategy (environment, social and governance), with the aim of ensuring a continuous improvement in the sustainability fields of the 2026 Porsche Carrera Cup Italia and 2026 Porsche Taycan Rush activities.

In this regard, Porsche Italia S.p.A. is committed to achieving the following objectives in the design and implementation of the 2026 Porsche Carrera Cup Italia and 2026 Porsche Taycan Rush activities:

### Environmental

- **Circular economy** – reducing waste production by promoting the circular economy, recycling, reuse and repair.
- **Energy efficiency** – improving energy consumption by choosing energy-efficient equipment and prioritizing energy supplied exclusively from renewable sources, where possible.
- **Resource management** – managing natural resources responsibly, preventing risks to environment and biodiversity.
- **Environmental impact** – committing to reducing water and carbon footprint of its operations over time.

- **Corporate culture** – creating a fair and respectful working environment encouraging employees' wellbeing.
- **Engagement and training** – periodically training and informing employees and interested parties about sustainability issues and their contribution to achieving the set objectives.
- **Impact on community** – generating a direct and indirect positive impact on the local economic and social fabric by purchasing goods and/or services.

- **Inclusion** – enhancing an inclusive approach that breaks down physical and cultural barriers, transforming every aspect of the event accessible and open to everyone.

### Governance

- **Human rights** – acting in compliance with international conventions and guidelines to ensure respect for human and children's rights.
- **Legal compliance** – complying with current internal, national and international regulations on environment, labor, health and safety.
- **ISO 20121:2024 values** – acting in accordance with the principles of the 4.5 Mission Statement.
- **Sustainable supply chain** – evaluating the choice of supply chain considering also environmental social and local economy criteria.
- **Continuous improvement** – engaging reporting annually on the results achieved during the championships and assessing lessons learned by drafting an improvement plan for next season, in order to promote continuous improvement.
- **Stakeholders' engagement** – involving and informing all interest parties on sustainability issues (such as Porsche Italia's staff, direct collaborators, volunteers, suppliers, partners and sponsors involved in the championships; teams, drivers and Porsche Centres competing in the championships; circuits; the media and spectators participating in events; the community and local authorities in the territories involved; federations and ACI Racing Weekend events; Porsche AG), taking into account their needs and expectations.


Sustainable Development Goals pursued: SDG 9: industry, innovation and infrastructure; SDG 12: responsible consumption and production.
